VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE RESOURCES PERMIT TO POSSESS, PROPAGATE, BUY, AND SELL CERTAIN WILDLIFE PERMIT CONDITIONS

Pursuant to 4 VAC 15-30-10 of the Virginia Administrative Code it shall be unlawful to import, export, buy, sell, offer for sale, or liberate within the Commonwealth any wild animal unless otherwise specifically permitted by law or regulation. Under authority of § 29.1-103 (11) and § 29.1-412 of the Code of Virginia, the Posses, Propagate, Buy, and Sell Certain Wildlife Permit shall authorize the holder to buy, possess, propagate, and sell certain wildlife.

PROPAGATION AND SELL PERMIT INFORMATION

- 1. **Application**: Application for a permit and an application fee shall be submitted to the Commonwealth of Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources, Permits Section, P. O. Box 3337, Henrico, VA 23228. (All checks made payable to the "Treasurer of Virginia".)
- 2. **Term of Permit:** Propagation permits are issued on a calendar year basis and expire each December 31st and must be renewed annually. All permits will expire December 31st, regardless of date of issuance. It shall be the responsibility of the permittee to initiate any and all renewals.
- 3. **Authorized Stocks:** The following species are authorized for possession and sale by this permit: **Furbearers Fur Farming Only** (Captive-bred and raised)

Mink (<u>Mustela vison</u>)
Red Fox (<u>Vulpes vulpes</u>)
Grey Fox (Urocyon cinereoargenteus)

Game Birds (Captive-bred and raised)

Bobwhite Quail (<u>Colinus virginianus</u>)
Ring-necked Pheasant (<u>Phasianus colchicus</u>) including all subspecies and hybrids
Hungarian Partridge (<u>Perdix perdix</u>)
Chukar (Alectoris chukar)

Migratory Game Birds (captive-bred and raised):

Ducks ☐ all species native to Virginia ☐
Geese ☐ all species native to Virginia ☐
Swans (Mute swans (Cygnus olor), will not be permitted for possession, propagation,
purchase or sale on any new applications.)

4. Exceptions and Restrictions:

- a) No species listed as threatened or endangered shall be possessed or sold under the authority of this permit.
- b) No permit is required to hold purchased captive-bred game birds (as listed above) if being used on a licensed shooting preserve or for dog training on private land provided that the birds are not kept for propagation purposes.

c) No new permits will be issued for the possession, propagation, purchase or sale of mute swans (Cygnus olor).

5. Record Keeping:

- a) Game Bird Propagator: Holders of permits issued under § 29.1-417 of the Code of Virginia to breed and rear captive bred game birds and to sell and ship them alive for propagation or stocking shall keep a record showing the number of species on hand, the number raised or acquired and the number sold (4 VAC 15-290-30, Virginia Administrative Code). Permittee shall make these records available to the Department, if requested, should a disease outbreak be discovered. Records shall be retained by permittee fora period of one year.
- b) Fur Farming Operation: A holder of a permit to breed fur-bearing animals shall keep a record of the number of animals raised or acquired, and the number of animals, furs or carcasses sold or disposed of. The permittee shall provide reports to the agency at an interval specified on the permit (4 VAC 15-280-30, Virginia Administrative Code).
- 6. **Annual Report Requirement:** An annual report for the previous permitting year shall be submitted to the Department with the individual's renewal application. Failure to submit the annual report may be grounds for non-renewal of an individual's permit. For migratory game bird propagators, a copy of their previous year's federal report listing the species propagated under authorization of this permit will suffice as the annual report.
- 7. **Fur-Farming Operations:** Furbearers may only be raised and bred for bona fide and proven fur-farming operations.

8. Prohibitions on Release of Propagated Stocks and Offspring to the Wild:

Permittee is prohibited from releasing stocks or offspring to the wild except as listed below:

- a) Captive bred and raised Bobwhite quail, Ring-necked pheasant, Hungarian partridge, Chukar, and/or Mallard ducks, including all subspecies and hybrids, may be released on licensed shooting preserves under conditions specified for shooting preserves.
- b) Captive bred and raised Bobwhite quail, Ring-necked pheasant, and captive raised and properly marked Mallards may be released for licensed field trials or for dog training on private property provided that no other law or regulation prohibits their release at a specific location or during a specific season. Mallards must be marked as outlined in Title 50, §21.13b, in the Code of Federal Regulations.
- c) Captive bred and raised Ring-necked pheasant may be released on land owned or leased by the permittee. §29.1-514 B 1, Code of Virginia.
- d) It shall be lawful to release pen-raised Bobwhite quail on private lands with permission of the landowner. Released pen-raised quail may be recaptured using a call back cage. For the purposes of this section, a call back cage is defined as a cage, pen, box, or barrel with one or more funnel entrances to allow penraised quail to enter from the outside. The call back cage must contain one or more live pen-raised bobwhites (call birds). Each call back cage shall be marked by means of a nonferrous metal tag bearing the name and address of the person operating such call back cage. No bait or food may be placed outside of the call back cage and no call back cages may be set on lands without permission of the landowner (4 VAC 15-190-60, Virginia Administrative Code).
- 9. **Labeling Packages:** Packages containing captive bred game birds raised under a permit for propagation purposes shall bear labels showing the name and address of the breeder and the contents of the package (4 VAC 15-290-40, Virginia Administrative Code).

- 10. **Facility Standards:** As stated in 4 VAC 15-290-50, birds and animals raised under a permit for propagation purposes must be confined in a sanitary escape-proof enclosure.
- 11. **Inspections**: Authorized representatives of the Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources may make periodic inspections of the facility and stocks of each operation, and permittee shall allow such inspections at any reasonable time.
- 12. **Federal Waterfowl Permit:** Dealing in migratory waterfowl also requires a Federal Waterfowl Sale and Disposal Permit, obtainable through the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Assistant Regional Director, Division of Law, P. O. Box 779, Hadley, MA 01035-0779; (413) 253-8643.
- 13. Other Laws and Regulations: This permit does not absolve the permittee of any responsibilities or conditions of any other federal, state, or local laws and regulations.

14. Compliance/Violation/Revocation

- A. 4 VAC 15-290-130 of the Virginia Administrative Code states that a permit holder shall comply with all terms and conditions of any permit issued by the Department of Wildlife Resources pursuant to Title 29.1 of the Code of Virginia and the regulations of the board pertaining to hunting, fishing, trapping, attempting to take, possession, sale, offering for sale, transporting or causing to be transported, importing or exporting, propagating, exhibiting, and rehabilitating of any wild bird, wild animal or fish. The penalty for violation of this section is a Class 3 misdemeanor unless another penalty is specified. Further, any violation of state or federal wildlife laws related to the permitted activities by the permittee, his/her agents or employees, or guests will constitute a violation of the conditions of the permit.
- B. As provided by 4 VAC 15-30-5 of the Virginia Administrative Code, failure to comply with the provisions of a permit may result in the revocation or suspension of the permit for a period up to but not to exceed five (5) years. Any person whose permit is revoked, or suspended may appeal that decision in writing, to the Executive Director, Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources, P. O. Box 33337 Henrico, VA 23228.
- 15. Continuation of Permitted Activity: 4 VAC 15-30-7 of the Virginia Administrative Code states that provided that the issuance of a permit renewal has been delayed past the expiration date of the permittee's previous permit at no fault of the applicant, the permittee may continue the specific activities authorized by the expired permit until the Department has acted on such person's application for renewal. To qualify for this allowance, applicants must submit a completed renewal application to the Department at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of the permit. The Department may deny renewal of a permit to any applicant who fails to meet the issuance criteria set forth by the Department.

Note: The Department of Agriculture requires anyone dealing in game birds or migratory game birds to register with the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Also, there are health requirements governing the admission of animals and birds into Virginia.
